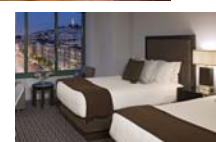
EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- ◆ Compare and contrast new and emerging drug therapies for the management of epilepsy.
- ◆ Critically discuss contemporary options for drugs and devices used to enhance outcomes for patients with atrial fibrillation.
- ◆ Evaluate the significance of potential drug-drug and drug-disease interactions of over-the-counter medications.
- ◆ Describe how obesity as a component of the metabolic syndrome affects health and how lifestyle changes and medications have a therapeutic effect.
- ◆ Use concepts of nutritional therapy to devise interventions balancing healthy food choices to optimize glucose control and reduce cardiovascular disease risk.
- ◆ Create medication dosing adjustments in the setting of renal impairment.
- ◆ Describe advances and controversies with the use of psychiatric medication in children.
- ◆ Formulate therapeutic choices using new drugs or new uses of older drugs for the management of patients with schizophrenia.
- ◆ Integrate knowledge about pain medications to create a pain management plan in chronic pain patients.
- ◆ Create an individualized patient approach in managing patients with gout using knowledge of the pathogenesis, new drugs, comorbidities and treatment outcomes.
- ◆ Critically discuss topics associated with the current influenza pandemic.
- ◆ Apply knowledge of recent legal developments into pharmacy practice.
- ◆ Recommend optimal pharmacotherapies for the prevention and treatment of osteoporosis in women.
